- Si la phrase **NE** contient pas de marqueur de temps, le verbe doit être au **PRESENT PERFECT**. Tu dois donc écrire 2 mots : **have/has** (pour la 3^e pers. du singulier) + **participe passé**, c'est-à-dire la 3^e colonne.

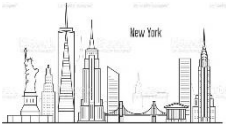

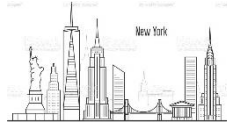
